

- Machinery Regulation (MR) and its implementation phase
- Development of harmonised standards and other standardisation-related matters
  - EN 474-1
  - Regulation 1025/2012  $\rightarrow$  under evaluation  $\rightarrow$  CECE contributed to the PC via Orgalim (<u>link</u>)
- Other legislations e.g.
  - Radio Equipment Directive (RED)
    - Delegated Regulation (EU) **2023/2444** → Application date: August 1, 2025 (<u>link</u>)
  - Pressure Equipment Directive (PED)

## PT Machinery



### **Machinery Regulation:**

- December 2022: the EU institutions reached a provisional agreement
- OJEU publication in June 2023 (link)
- Entry into force: 19 July 2023

### **Application Date: 20 January 2027**

- No voluntary application of MR by manufacturers before 2027
- **Transitional period** provided in the new Regulation is 42 months (3½ years)

#### Standardisation related matters

#### EN 474-1

- Commission <u>Implementing Decision 2023/1586</u>: Entered into force August 2, supporting the Machinery Directive.
- Harmonised Standards for Earth-Moving Machinery: Part 3 references standards from EN 474-1:2022 to EN 474-13:2022.
- Date of withdrawal: 2 February 2025

**Next Steps:** Monitoring publication of the first Machinery Regulation standards in the OJ and the last under the Machinery Directive (MD)



**Continuity of Presumption of Conformity**: Ensuring that hENs cited under MD maintain their presumption of conformity when carried over to the MR.

- Key Exercise: Transfer as many hENs from MD OJEU to MR OJEU as possible.
- Challenge: Most current hENs don't fully cover the new EHSRs of MR, and revising all by Jan. 2027 is unrealistic.
- Solution: Perform a gap analysis to assess the impact of new or modified EHSRs on hENs under MD.
  - *Deadline*: End of **October 2024** for hENs already cited in OJEU, with a longer deadline expected for those to be cited in 2025.

#### **Draft Standardization Request**

- Important to finalise Standardization Request very soon → legal basis for hENs for MR
- The EC confirmed that the work is coming to an end



#### **Radio Equipment Directive**


- Citation of EN 18031-1/2/3 Standards (RED)
- Guide to **application** → task under AdCo
- RED Cybersecurity standardisation developments (Common security requirements for radio equipment)
  - EN 18031-1:2024 Part 1: Internet connected radio equipment
  - EN 18031-2:2024 Part 2: radio equipment processing data
  - EN 18031-3:2024 Part 3: Internet connected radio equipment processing virtual money or monetary value



**Status**: Awaiting EUOJ citation; approved by NSBs but negatively assessed by the HAS consultant.

**Scope & Use**: Applies to radio equipment with cybersecurity elements, ensuring RED compliance, and could aid CRA compliance despite its broader scope.

Citation expected for Directive 2014/53/EU

### Main topics followed

- Data Act New horizontal regulation on data access and use
- Cyber Resilience Act (CRA) Proposal for a regulation on horizontal cybersecurity requirements for products with digital elements
- Artificial Intelligence Act (AIA) New regulation on harmonised rules on artificial intelligence

### Other legislation monitored

- Radio Equipment Directive (Delegated act on interconnected radio equipment)
- Al Liability Directive (Proposal for a Directive on adapting non contractual civil liability rules to artificial intelligence)



#### Data Act

- Published in the EU's Official Journal in December 2023 (link)
- Entered into force on 11 January 2024
- Application will start in <u>September 2025</u>
  - With no design changes for products available on the market
- Design obligation applicable to new product after <u>September 2026</u>
  - → With <u>certain flexibility</u> for manufacturers' discretion on design choices

#### **CECE advocacy & activities**

- ✓ CECE Ad-hoc Group of experts to assess the impact on the sector
- ✓ Participation in **sectoral workshops** organised by the Commission
- ✓ Development of **industry common guidance** for the Data Act implementation



### Cyber Resilience Act (CRA)

- Provisional agreement reached in November 2023
- Final legal text officially adopted on 10 October (link)
- Publication in the EU's Official Journal expected in the coming weeks
- The new regulation will be applicable in Q4 2027
  - ☐ Transition period equal to 36 months (3-years time after entry in force)

#### **CECE advocacy & activities**

- ✓ Main theme of the **CECE Summit 2023** in Brussels (Panel discussion)
- ✓ Cooperation with other industry associations on application timeline and implementation
- ✓ Focus on the **interplay with the Machinery regulation**(Commission's guidance will be published)
- ✓ Monitor the transition from the RED DA to **CRA standards** (to be published by Q3 2026)

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### Artificial Intelligence Act (AIA)

- Published in the EU's Official Journal in July 2024 (<u>link</u>)
- Entered into force on 1 August 2024
- Gradual phasing-in: Fully applicable in <u>August 2026</u>
  - → High-risk AI machinery obligations applicable from 2 August 2027

- ✓ Focus on **AI system definition** in comparison with the Machinery Reg (& high-risk machinery)
- ✓ Focus on the **interplay with the RED** (EC interpretation of radio equipment classified as high-risk AI)
- ✓ Cooperation with Orgalim on next steps & implementation

### Main topics followed

- Revised F-gases regulation New regulation on fluorinated greenhouse gases
- **Ecodesign for Sustainable Products Regulation (ESPR)** New framework regulation for setting ecodesign requirements on specific product groups
- Batteries and Waste Batteries regulation New regulation on sustainability, safety, labelling, marking and information requirements for the placing on the market or putting into service of batteries in the EU
- REACH
  - **REACH revision** to reform the REACH authorization and restriction processes & extend to professional users the level of protection granted to consumers
  - Universal restriction proposal on Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFASs), including when used in articles

### Other legislation monitored

• **EU Deforestation Regulation** – New regulation on the making available on the market and the export from the Union of certain commodities and products associated with deforestation and forest degradation

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### **Revised F-gases regulation**

- Published in the EU's Official Journal in February 2024 (link)
- Entered into force on <u>11 March 2024</u>
- The Commission started implementation in September 2024 (link)

#### **Key issues identified**

New registration and labelling requirements for R-1234yf and R-134a, and new import and export rules.

#### **CECE advocacy & activities**

- ✓ CECE engaged with the Spanish Presidency of the Council on R-1234yf
- ✓ CECE monitors the publication of secondary legislation (Implementing Acts)



### Ecodesign for Sustainable Products Regulation (ESPR)

- Published in the EU's Official Journal and entered into force on <u>18 July 2024</u> (link)
- Commission's Standardisation Request on DPP published in late July 2024
- Measures on steel and iron expected in Q3-Q4 2025 (applicable in mid-2027)
- FAQs document published on 25 September 2024 > clarifications on new definitions and DPPs
- The ESPR Working Plan is expected in March 2025

- New definitions of **Substances of Concern (SoC)**, **remanufacturing**, **refurbishing**, **component**
- Digital Product Passport (DPP)

#### **CECE advocacy & activities**

- ✓ CECE is monitoring the implementation workplan & new measures for product categories
- ✓ CECE is involved in consultation on Commission's Preparatory Study on Steel and Iron

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### Batteries and Waste Batteries regulation

- Published in the EU's Official Journal in July 2023 (link)
- Entered into force in August 2023
- Application started in <u>February 2024</u>
- Batteries Directive will be repealed in August 2025
- Fully applicable in <u>August 2036</u>
- Commission's Standardisation Request on DPP published in late July 2024

#### **CECE advocacy & activities**

- ✓ CECE successful advocacy on the SLI definition, BMS scope and date of placing on the EU market
- ✓ CECE submitted feedback on **Commission's Guidelines** in March 2024
- ✓ CECE is involved in stakeholder consultations (public and closed) and Commission's workshops on Performance & Durability and Due Diligence requirements
- ✓ CECE monitors the standardization works regarding the DPP (incl. Battery Passport)




### PFAS restrictions (under REACH)

- The European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) published PFAS restriction proposal on 7 February 2023
- ECHA committees on Risk Assessment (RAC) and Socio-Economic Analysis (SEAC) started evaluation
- F-gases applications & Transport (incl. NRMM tbc) sectors to be evaluated in March 2025
- ECHA RAC and SEAC to publish Opinions by end 2025
- New ECHA Stakeholder Consultation expected in 2025

- ✓ CECE Position Paper released on 17 May 2023 (<u>link</u>)
- ✓ Joint industry letter to DG GROW and DG ENV (CECE, CEMA, EGMF, FEM)
- ✓ Joint industry questions on the sectors' scope to ECHA (CECE, EUROMOT, CEMA, EGMF)
- ✓ CECE will submit feedback on ECHA's SEAC Opinion
- ✓ The **JTLM Joint Declaration on PFAS** published in May 2024 (International advocacy) (<u>link</u>)

- Follow of Regulation (EU) 2016/1628 (stage V) on requirements relating to gaseous and particulate pollutant emissions limits and type- approval for internal combustion engines for non-road mobile machinery.
- UK- GB engine type-approval after BREXIT (covered on the Brexit presentation)
- European Low Emissions Zones (LEZ) and requirements
- Retrofitting requirements for construction machinery
- Worldwide engine emissions requirements for NRMM
- Alternative fuels for construction machinery



#### Regulation (EU) 2016/1628 (stage V)

- Stage V Report: Expected in 2025 (but no precise timeline), potentially sparking preliminary discussions for a Stage VI.
- Some Member States are already beginning to develop positions on the future of Stage VI.
- Next Steps: New European Commission to assess potential revision of the regulation in the coming years.

**CECE** is member of the European Commission Non-Road Mobile Machinery working group - **GEME**.



### European Low Emissions Zones (LEZ) and requirements (for members only)

- Compilation of requirements for construction machinery in the Low Emission Zone (LEZ)
  per country/region or local area.
- Compilation of national initiatives for carbon reduction.

### Alternative fuels


- Identify alternative fuels and suitability for construction machinery.
- Monitor developments in distribution and handling of alternative fuels.
- Identify and map existing legislation & standards related to alternative fuels.



### **CECE** key actions:

• Retrofitting – update the position paper to only focus on retrofitting

- Monitoring: Revised Ambient Air Quality Directive (AAQD)
  - Assessment Thresholds for Health Protection
  - Short-term action plans defining emergency measures mitigate the immediate risk to human health in areas where the alert thresholds will be exceeded.





### PT Electrification



### Main topics followed


- Identify and map existing legislation & standards applicable to electrically driven machines, the energy supply and related systems for construction equipment products, at a European and international level.
- Perform a gap analysis identifying needs of further legislation & standards for construction machinery sector.
- Advocacy actions in coordination with other non-road mobile machinery associations and stakeholders.

## PT Electrification



### **CECE** key actions:

- Interpretation of UNECE R100 & UNECE R85 by the Notified Bodies across the EU → joint with PT Road
- Outdoor Noise Directive, in reference to electric driven machines → joint with PT Noise.
- Identification of most relevant legislation & standards applicable to electrically driven.

- Commission initiatives and work in progress (e.g., public consultations)

### **PT Road**



#### Regulation on Non-Road Mobile Machinery (NRMM) circulating on public roads

- Proposal in March 2023
- EP Plenary: adoption provisional agreement in May
- Publication and entry into force expected in Q4

#### **Key characteristics:**

- U-category
- Small series threshold: 70
- Individual approval
- Scope: self-propelled machinery only (towed machinery equipment not covered)
- Delegated acts to establish the methodology for calculating the threshold values
- Implementing acts to set the threshold values themselves
- Member States retain the power to prohibit the use of fully autonomous machinery

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### **PT Road**




#### **Next Steps:**

- Publication of the delegated acts to the framework proposal (2 years)
- ✓ CECE will be involved at every stage of the legislative process

### FKA/TRL study on the type approval of NRMM (ongoing)

- Focus: development of the EU technical requirements for NRMM intended to circulate on the road that will be included in the secondary legislation to the EU NRMM Type approval regulation
- Expected to be published in Q4

- Outdoor Noise Directive (OND): Directive 2000/14/EC
  - Main focus: Annex III on the methodologies for measuring the sound power levels of equipment used outdoors.
- Electric driven machines

### **PT Noise**



### Revision of Annex III of OND

- Delegated Regulation (EU) 2024/1208 amending <u>Annex III OND</u>
- Publication in OJEU on 2 May 2024
- Application (12 months) → 22 May 2025
- Transition period for existing products (3-year)
  - Different transition period for Art. 12 and 13

### **Full Revision of the OND:**

- No Current Plans: no initiatives planned in the coming future.
- **CECE Monitoring**: CECE will closely monitor potential new plans under the new European Commission.

### **PT Noise**



### <u>Simplifying Reporting Requirements – Article 16 OND</u>

- EC aims to **simplify reporting** for manufacturers by removing Article 16 of the OND and reducing reporting requirements by 25%.
- Consultation: CECE submitted a position paper supporting the proposal.
- Institutions' adoption:
  - ✓ On March 14, 2024: the EP fully endorsed the EC proposal.
  - ✓ On 8 October : Council approved EP's first reading.

Next Steps: finalisation and publication in the Official Journal of the EU
